

1. To be eligible for Adelphi University's STEM Scholars program for the **2025-2026** academic year and beyond, you need to meet the requirements listed below. Please note, this award only applies to your Fall and Spring semesters of study (50% will be disbursed in the Fall, 50% will be disbursed in the Spring).
    - Enroll in full-time study at Adelphi University with a minimum of twelve (12) credits **per semester**, pursuing a bachelor's degree in one of the following majors: biology, biochemistry, chemistry, computer science, environmental science, mathematics, statistics, or physics. Please note, changing majors to one outside of this list will result in loss of this scholarship. If you need to drop to part-time, contact the program director, Dr. Andrea Ward, to discuss the impacts to the award;
    - **Successfully complete** a minimum of 24 credits each academic year in your program of study (*be cautious, failures and withdrawals may impact successful completion*);
    - Maintain a cumulative grade-point average of **2.5** throughout each academic year while pursuing your bachelor's degree at Adelphi University. Students that drop below a 2.5 cumulative GPA may be put on probation for the STEM Scholars program. Students who stay below a 2.5 cumulative GPA for two semesters may be removed from the program;
    - Maintain Pell eligibility each academic year.
  2. Students are highly encouraged to participate in academic and social support associated with the STEM Scholars program.
  3. All STEM Scholars Award recipients must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) annually with the U.S. Department of Education, even if you don't expect financial assistance. After filing, Adelphi's One-Stop Student Services Center will provide a College Financing Plan (CFP) outlining your costs.
    - The amount of the award may be adjusted based on your unmet need as determined by One-Stop and thus may change annually based on changes to results from the FAFSA. The maximum annual award is \$15,000. The maximum total award over four years is \$60,000.
  4. The total of your combined scholarships cannot exceed the cost of attendance at Adelphi University.
    - You must notify Adelphi's One-Stop Student Services Center of any additional scholarship awards you receive. Please note, these awards may be adjusted to ensure compliance with all institutional, federal and state regulations.
      - This includes but is not limited to factors like Veterans educational benefits, external awards, and federal and state scholarships and grants.
  5. Undergraduate scholarships and grants are typically awarded for full-time enrollment. However, the University may waive the full-time enrollment requirement in cases of qualifying disabilities, as determined by the Student Access Office. For details on this waiver and prorated scholarships, please reach out to the One-Stop Student Services Center.
  6. Adelphi reserves the right to revoke this award based on academic or behavioral violations.
  7. This scholarship is funded by the National Science Foundation. If the award from the National Science Foundation is terminated, this award may also be revoked.
