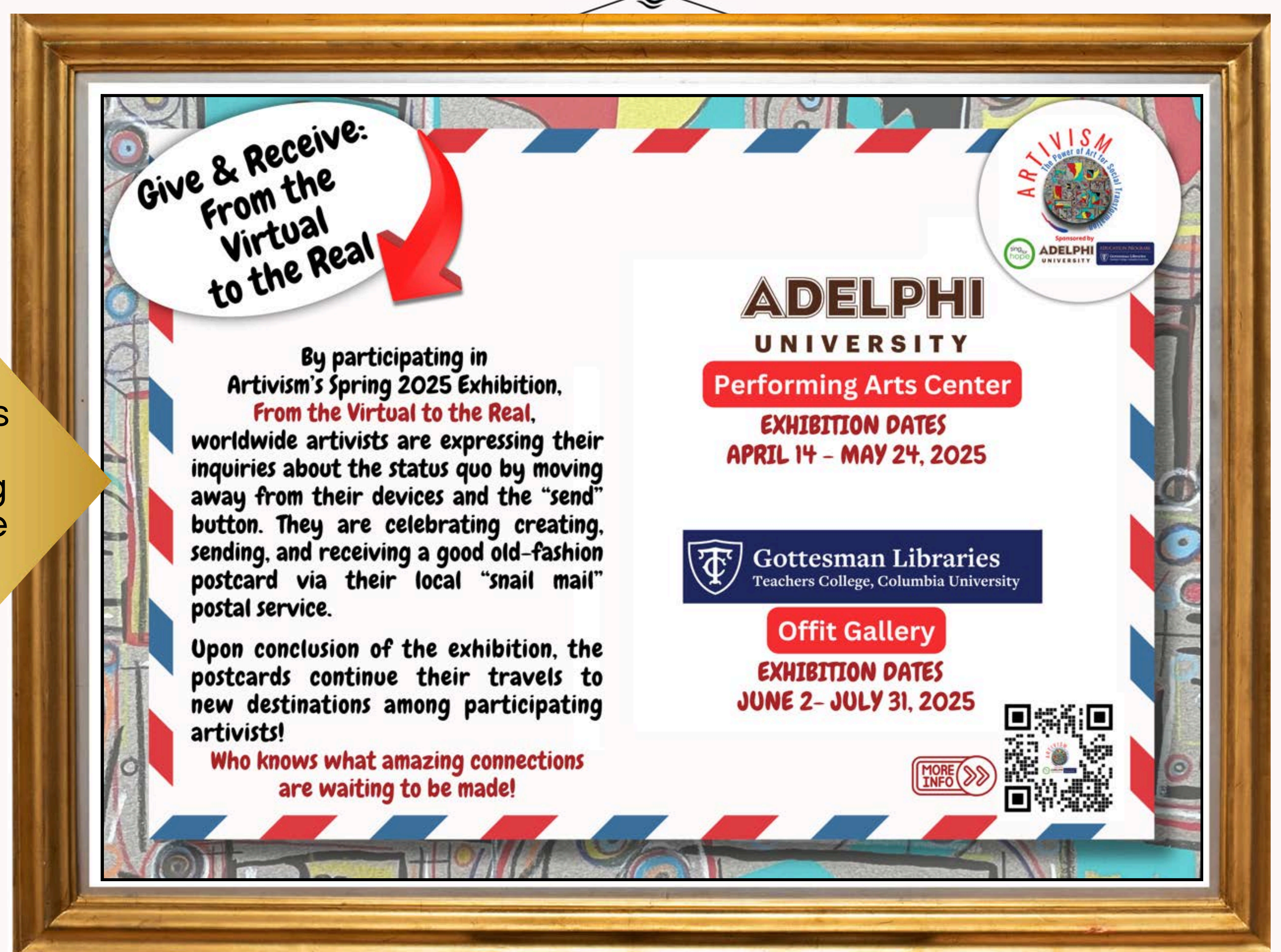
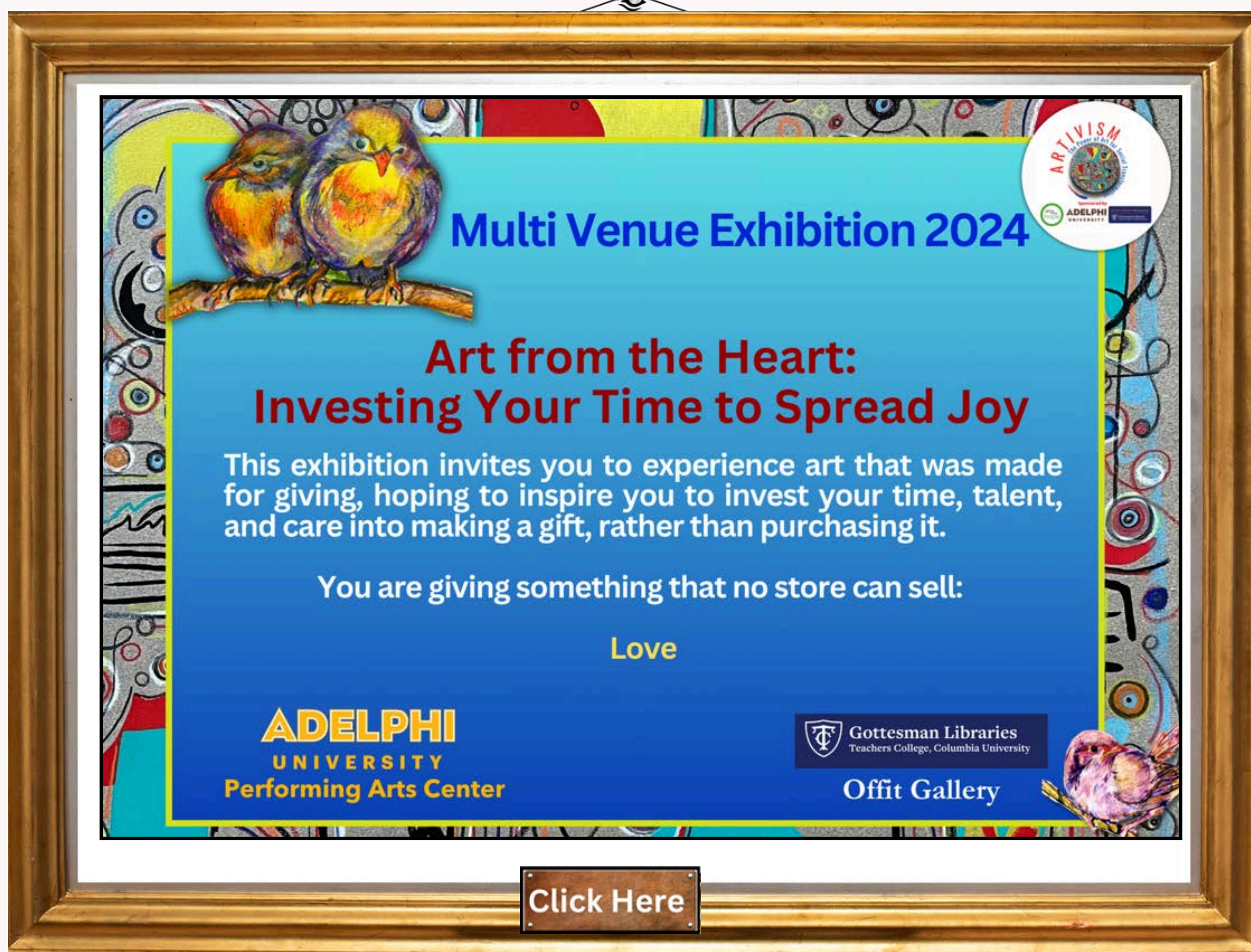
Each year, the exhibition focuses on a particular theme, with the hope of expanding people's perspective on what could or should be an art exhibit. These displays question terminology and categorization, ideas often used in the art world to exclude.

Rather, by opening the "gallery doors", participating artists' self-esteem, confidence- building, and technical skills have expanded. The annual multi-venue exhibitions have become events that build community, where they take pride in sharing their work with each other, their friends, and families.

Whether expressing their social concerns, raising awareness about fast fashion while walking the runway, investing their time into making rather than purchasing a gift, or creating a "traditional postcard" to be sent via snail mail, these artists exhibit creative works (traditionally considered perhaps unconventional) that spark thought-provoking conversations. They are taking action to address social inequity and are the transformation because they are doing, not just thinking!


And what are they doing? They are combatting social parameters that hinder, paralyze, and/or strips confidence away and replacing these conditioned negative social perceptions with possibilities, hope, strength, and courage.
